Please add this email and attached information to the IRP website. The attachments include my petition, ATSDR response and related information, and letters received in opposition to my petition which show that the opposition could be traced to Dan Hirsch and his surrogates. Also attached is a letter from EPA to a Hirsch surrogate that summarizes Hirsch and company opposition to the request to EPA for TASC support in 2009. Supporting documentation will be available from the EPA on November 10, 2016. The purpose of this information is to demonstrate conclusively that one segment of the public can improperly dominate public participation in a DTSC activity to the detriment of DTSC, its ability to perform its proper function, and in the case of SSFL cleanup, to delay an appropriate cleanup.

Additionally, I reiterate that my connection with SSFL stopped when I left the employment of Atomics International in 1965. My participation now is only as a very knowledgeable volunteer citizen stakeholder.

I am also sending this email and any subsequent emails to the DTSC managers who attended the IRP meeting in Chatsworth, so that they can become fully conversant with what has transpired in the past. I am also including Allan Ono, who attended the meeting, to support my earlier request for an audit by the State of California of the political interference in the SSFL cleanup. Dear Community Member:

In December 2008, an EPA fact sheet announced the availability of the Technical Assistance Services for Communities (TASC) program for its work at the Santa Susana Field Laboratory (SSFL). The TASC is funded and managed under a national EPA contract, and provides an independent environmental expert to assist the community to understand EPA's work and provide input into the process.

Initially, two groups made formal expressions of interest in receiving TASC services, followed later by a third group. Through numerous discussions with various active members of the community, EPA learned that there was opposition to TASC.

On May 27, 2009, a TASC informational meeting was attended by a TASC contractor and many community members who expressed strongly-held opposing viewpoints. While some attendees supported TASC and wanted to receive TASC services, others were opposed to TASC being made available to any group.

Some attendees questioned the TASC program's ability to find an independent technical advisor sufficiently qualified to review the highly technical radiological documents. Others claimed that the existing SSFL Interagency Workgroup was sufficient to meet their needs and protested the additional meetings they would have to attend. Some were concerned that TASC would not be focused on EPA's work but on long-debated sources of the original contamination and challenges about claimed past health impacts.

EPA spent considerable time considering all of the comments received at the informational meeting, and through phone calls and direct conversations. EPA attempted to find a process to provide TASC services that was inclusive of various perspectives while addressing concerns.

Based on significant opposition to TASC, EPA Region IX has decided not to provide TASC services for its radiological survey work at the SSFL, at the present time. EPA remains open to providing TASC services if an appropriate process can be established or potentially folded into the public participation efforts of the State agency that has lead responsibility for the cleanup, DTSC.
