Dear Mr. Sujata:

This is to confirm and follow-up on our conversation on January 19, 2007. During the cleanup and closure of Buildings 29 and 133, Boeing will request review of radiologic profiling for soils excavated from Buildings 29 and 133 from the Department of Health Services/Radiologic Health Branch (DHS/RHB), and obtain concurrence in writing from the DHS/RHB that there are no radiologic restrictions on soils prior to offsite shipments to appropriately authorized facilities. If DHS/RHB does not concur that there is an absence of radiologic restrictions, Boeing will ship the soils to a disposal facility authorized to receive such waste.

Although we did not talk about other materials removed during the cleanup and closure process (such as non-soil scraps and wash rinseates), DTSC expects Boeing to follow the same procedures for those wastes as for soils (i.e. DHS/RHB review and
