

STANDARDIZED PERMIT RENEWAL ACTIVITY FEES AND ANNUAL FEES

For standardized permit renewals, facilities shall pay an amount equal to the fee that would have been assessed had the facility requested the same changes in a modification application, but not less than one-half the fee required for a new permit (California Health and Safety Code, Section 25205.7(d)(1)(I)).

If a standardized treatment and/or storage facility requests no changes in their renewal permit application or changes equivalent to a Class 1 or Class 2 permit modification, then the renewal fee shall be equal to one-half the fee required for a new permit.

If a standardized treatment and/or storage facility requests changes in their renewal permit application equivalent to a Class 3 modification, then the renewal fee shall be equal to 80% of the fee required for a new permit.
