

## **John P. Knezovich, Ph.D.**

John Knezovich is the director of the Center for Accelerator Mass Spectrometry (CAMS) at the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory. He is also an adjunct Professor of Environmental Chemistry at UC Davis and the director of the UC Toxic Substances Research & Teaching Program (UC TSR&TP). John received his B.A. in Biology from the University of the Pacific in 1977 and his Ph.D. in Chemical Ecology from UC Davis in 1983. He has broad experience in developing and using experimental approaches for discerning the environmental fate and toxicity of chemicals. As the director of CAMS, he oversees a team of scientists who are applying ion-beam and nuclear physics techniques to a broad range of environmental and biomedical research topics. As director of the UC TSR&TP, he is focused on establishing interdisciplinary research and education programs within the UC system that meet existing and emerging needs within California.
