

**U.S. Army Proposes Soil Removal Action for
IRP Site PRFTA-02**

The U. S. Department of the Army (Army), in cooperation with the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) and the California Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB), announce the public comment period for the Proposed Plan for Installation Restoration Program (IRP) Site PRFTA-02 at U. S. Army Garrison Camp Parks (Camp Parks) in Dublin, California. The Army has conducted environmental investigations at PRFTA-02, the Former Building 109 Incinerator Site. The investigations are complete and are summarized in a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS) Report.

The Army plans that future land use will be for commercial/industrial purposes. The Army determined that there is potential risk for future construction workers from certain contaminants in soil. Due to the potential risk to future construction workers, the Army plans to remove soil with contaminants of concern to achieve industrial cleanup goals. The soil will be disposed at an appropriate off-site disposal location. The Army selected the soil removal action remedy after conducting a detailed evaluation of remedial alternatives in the RI/FS Report. Other evaluated remedial alternatives included No Action, Institutional and Engineering Controls, and an Engineered Cap over the contaminated soil. The Proposed Plan recommends a soil removal action as the final remedy for the site. DTSC and RWQCB concur with the removal action recommendation.

The Proposed Plan summarizes the site history and background, site characteristics, removal action, and site risks. Copies of the Proposed Plan document for PRFTA-02 have been placed in the Information Repository located at the Dublin Library (Alameda County) and San Ramon Public Library (Contra Costa County) and are available for public review and comment. The Proposed Plan is expected to lead to the removal action and closure of PRFTA-02. Copies of supporting documents, including the RI/FS Report, also are available in the Information Repository.

The Army, as lead agency under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), selected the soil removal action remedy for PRFTA-02. The Army will

consider public input to the Proposed Plan and responses to public comments will be incorporated into the Record of Decision and Removal Action Work Plan. The formal public comment period for Site PRFTA-02 is 30 days and ends on December 9, 2010.
