## CLEANUP PROPOSAL FOR CARROLL HALL SHELBY TRUST PROPERTY, GARDENA, CA.

**WHAT IS BEING PROPOSED?** The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) invites you to comment on a proposed cleanup plan to remove Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) and metals in soil, and VOCs in groundwater located at the 3.4 acre Carroll Hall Shelby Trust (CHST) property located in Gardena, California. Past environmental investigations found elevated concentrations of VOCs and arsenic approximately between 5 and 15 feet below ground surface. A draft Removal Action Workplan (draft RAW) along with an environmental impact assessment required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) has been developed in order to clean up the property and is now open for public comment..

Recommended cleanup options for this property include soil excavation and removal, and bioremediation of groundwater.

#### Why This Notice and How You Can Participate:

This notice provides you an opportunity to learn more about the CHST property and submit public comments on the draft RAW and CEQA draft Negative Declaration (ND). The public comment period begins on May 14, 2013, and ends on June 13, 2013.
