Larry Gibbs, MEd, MPH, CIH

Larry Gibbs is Associate Vice-Provost for Environmental Health and Safety at Stanford University where he is responsible for health, safety, and environmental risk management programs in addition to oversight of institutional emergency planning and risk communication. Stanford has over 2500 laboratories on its campus involved in over \$700 million of research ranging from basic sciences and engineering to medical and human subjects clinical research. His work includes EH&S oversight of nanomaterials research conducted in materials science, engineering, medicine, chemistry and other research areas on campus. Larry is a lecturer at the Woods Institute for the Environment at Stanford and serves on the Stanford Board of Overseers for the SLAC National Accelerator Laboratory. He has graduate degrees in science education from Boston University and in industrial hygiene and public health from the University of Michigan.

Mr. Gibbs is a certified industrial hygienist with over 25 years of experience in academic, research and clinical institutions. In addition to his work at the university, he serves as a consultant for industrial, pharmaceutical, biotechnology and government organizations. He has authored over 25 publications, co-authored two books and served as officer and board member in a number of international professional associations. He is currently chairing the California Higher Education – DTSC – NIOSH Working Group developing Practical and Safe Guidelines for Academic Research Use of Nanomaterials.
