Terry Roberts serves as the director of the State Clearinghouse in the Governor's Office of Planning and Research (OPR). She has over 25 years of experience and proven leadership in state and local land use planning, with expertise in general plan law, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and regulatory permit processes.

Ms. Roberts oversees the State Clearinghouse as it carries out its three primary functions: to coordinate the state level review of environmental documents pursuant to CEQA, to provide technical assistance on land use planning and CEQA matters, and to coordinate state review of certain federal grants programs.

Ms. Roberts began her career as an analyst in OPR's State Clearinghouse, where she worked from 1979 to 1984. Then, from 1984 to 1989, she worked as a private consultant to municipalities and developers, preparing environmental assessments and facilitating permit acquisition for proposed development projects. In 1989, she joined the newly incorporated City of West Sacramento as a city planner.

Since 1999, Ms. Roberts has served as director of the State Clearinghouse, where she manages a staff of planners and technicians who carry out OPR's responsibilities for general plan and CEQA oversight and technical assistance. She also provides staff support to the Governor's Office on numerous interagency task forces and commissions relating to land use and environmental policy.

Ms. Roberts was born in Seoul, Korea. She holds a degree in zoology from the University of California at Berkeley.
