PROPOSED CLEANUP PLAN FOR FORMER UNIVAR USA, INC. SOUTH BONNIE BEACH PLACE FACILITY COMMERCE, CALIFORNIA

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: OCTOBER 6, 2016 — NOVEMBER 4, 2016

WHAT IS BEING PROPOSED? The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) invites you to review and comment on the proposed plan to cleanup chemical contamination at the former Univar USA, Inc. (Univar) S. Bonnie Beach Place Facility. The former facility was located on adjacent parcels of land at 4256 Noakes Street and 1363 South Bonnie Beach Place, Commerce, California 90023 (Site). Chemicals, including the solvents tetrachloroethylene (PCE) and trichloroethylene (TCE), were found in soil and groundwater at the site and surrounding area. The contaminated groundwater at the site is not used as a source of drinking water. Two documents, called the Corrective Measures Study (CMS) and the draft Statement of Basis, outline the proposed plan to clean up the site. DTSC will oversee the proposed cleanup activities. We invite you to review and comment on the proposed cleanup plan, describing the investigations which were carried out on the site and to evaluate the solution.

The Site was extensively investigated over the course of several years. The results of the site investigation are documented in a report called the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Facility Investigation (RFI) Summary Report and were described in a fact sheet mailed out to the community in June 2016.

The proposed cleanup plan describes those actions and measures that will be taken to clean up the contamination and control human exposure. The key elements of the proposed remedy include continuing and expanding the existing on-site soil vapor and groundwater treatment system, adding off-site groundwater treatment, enhanced monitoring of groundwater, and restricting future use of the property.

CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT: DTSC has considered the potential environmental impacts of the cleanup plan and has prepared an Initial Study and draft Negative Declaration. DTSC concluded that the implementation of the cleanup plan would not have a significant impact on the environment. The public is invited to comment on the draft Negative Declaration in addition to the cleanup plan.

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE? DTSC encourages you to take this opportunity to review the cleanup plan during the public comment period from **October 6, 2016 - November 4, 2016**. All comments must be received by **November 4, 2016**.
