Draft Standardized Hazardous Waste Permit for Crane's Waste, Inc. Facility is Available for Public Review and Comment

The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) invites you to review and comment on the draft Standardized Hazardous Waste Permit (draft Permit) for Crane's Waste Oil, Inc., 16095 Highway 178, Weldon, California 93283.

Facility Description

The Facility transfers and stores used oil, waste antifreeze, oily debris, and oily water. It consists of one storage unit area measuring 20.25 feet wide by 50 feet long with a 20-inch berm for secondary containment, and houses a concrete slab, two stationary tanker trailers and 21 55-gallon containers. Tanker trailer 1 has a capacity of 9,200 gallons. Tanker trailer 2 has a total capacity of 4,000 gallons and is subdivided into two equal-sized compartments of 2,000 gallons each.

The Facility has been in operation under the same ownership since 1981. DTSC issued Crane's a Standardized Hazardous Waste Facility Permit on December 23, 1997. On November 21, 2005, Crane's applied for a permit modification to reduce the number of permitted storage areas. On August 1, 2006, DTSC approved this modification. On May 21, 2007, Crane's submitted an application for the renewal of the Standardized Hazardous Waste Facility Permit.

Draft Permit

If the draft Permit is approved, Crane's Waste Oil, Inc. will continue to transfer and store used oil, waste antifreeze, oily debris, and oily water at the Facility for ten years. DTSC reviewed the draft Permit renewal application submitted by the owner for completeness and determined that it is complete and ready for public review and comment.

Public Comment Period

The public comment period begins May 27, 2009 and ends on July 13, 2009. Written comments must be postmarked or emailed by July 13, 2009 and sent to:

A public hearing is not scheduled at this time, but anyone interested can request a public hearing. A hearing request must be sent to Alejandro Galdamez at the address above and must be received by June 26, 2009. The hearing request must state the reason for holding a public hearing.

Enforcement History

DTSC has inspected the Facility on a regular basis to ensure they are in compliance with California laws, regulations, and the Permit conditions. The results of those inspections can be reviewed at DTSC's Regional Office located 700 Heinz Ave, Suite 200, Berkeley, California 94710, (510) 540-2685.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

Under the California Environmental Quality Act, DTSC must evaluate whether the draft Permit may have any significant impacts on human health and the environment.

As part of this evaluation, DTSC has proposed a Notice of Exemption (NOE) which concludes that activities will not result in any impact to human health or the environment. As a result, a Notice of Exemption has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of California Code of Regulation, Title 14, Section 15301.

You May Participate in Our Permitting Decisions

DTSC encourages public participation in the decision-making process and invites the public to review and comment on the draft Permit. Before making a final determination on the draft Permit, DTSC will review and respond in writing to all public comments.

A Response to Comments document will be sent to all those who submitted comments and to those who request a copy. A copy of the Response to Comments will also be placed in the information repositories established for this project.
