



BACKGROUND

Crosby & Overton Inc. submitted an application to the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) on December 16, 2002 to renew its RCRA Hazardous Waste Facility Permit (Permit). The Permit would allow Crosby & Overton, Inc. to continue to operate the hazardous waste storage and treatment facility at 1630 17th Street in Long Beach. The application was revised several times with the last revision being February 14, 2014. DTSC deemed the application to be complete and prepared a draft Permit. DTSC also prepared a draft Negative Declaration for public review during the draft permit public comment period for this project to comply with the California Environmental Quality Act. DTSC had two consecutive 45-day public comment periods for public to review and comment on the draft permit. The first public comment period ran from March 26 through May 9, 2014 and the second ran from June 4 through July 21, 2014. DTSC informed the public of a 45-day public comment period on the draft Permit by having display advertisements in the Press Telegram newspaper (English) and on the Impacto USA newspaper (Spanish). Copies of a fact sheet (in English and Spanish) were mailed to the persons on the facility mailing list, and DTSC's Mandatory Mailing list. A paid public notice announcing the public comment period was also aired in English on radio stations KFI FM and in Spanish on KTNQ AM. Also a public hearing was held on May 1, 2014 at the Cabrillo High School in Long Beach to solicit comments.

DTSC received one comment from the community. This document provides DTSC's response to that comment. The person who made the comment is identified and the comment is shown in italics and listed after the person's name. DTSC's response to the comment follows. This document will be provided to the commenter, placed in the information repositories for this project and added to the administrative record for the Final Permit Decision.

COMMENTER: Mario Diaz

Comment:

The Shell Travel Center is my direct neighbor to the south of me. Crosby & Overton is even further to the south of me....the reason for this note is to inform you that it seems that your personnel run a good, clean operation. I ride my bicycle around there in the evenings or early mornings at times, and it looks ok from the outside, and the aromas that leave your facility seem to not be too strong. I often do get strong smells of lacquer or similar aroma...I think it comes from Snug Top. I talked to them once to suggest to them that they stay on top of their filtration system as I did not want to report them outright to the SCAQMD. Other times I get smells that maybe come from World Oil, and hopefully it is not from Crosby & Overton.....be mindful of the reality that sometimes we community members can also be harmed with headaches from aromas. Thank You for the Community Notice and for reading this message.

Response:

Odors are regulated by the Southern California Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD). However, DTSC does evaluate all sources of emissions and ensures that other permits required from other federal state and local agencies are obtained to insure that emissions are minimized. In the case for Crosby & Overton Inc., a health risk assessment was prepared in 1992 and an odor study was evaluated for all sources at that time. The study concluded that the total maximum hourly concentrations of all chemicals from all sources were less than the respective odor thresholds of the chemicals, indicating that no odor problems are anticipated from Crosby & Overton, Inc.
