CONSENT ORDER

Health and Safety Code
Section 25187

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Parties. The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (Department) and Econco Broadcast Services (Respondent) enter into this Consent Order (Order) and agree as follows:

1.2. Site. Respondent is a wholly owned subsidiary of Communications & Power Industries (CPI) and is a remanufacturer of vacuum tubes. Respondent generates, handles, treats, stores, and/or disposes of hazardous waste at the following site: 1318 Commerce Avenue, Woodland, California 95776 (Site).

1.3. Inspection. The Department inspected the Site on March 28, 2011.

1.4. Authorization Status. Facility is a Large Quantity Generator of hazardous waste, and has been authorized by the Yolo County Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) to operate one (1) Evaporator and one (1) Distiller under recycling exemption 25143.2(c)(2) of the California Health and Safety Code.

1.5. Jurisdiction. Health and Safety Code, section 25187, authorizes the Department to order action necessary to correct violations and to assess a penalty when the Department determines that any person has violated specified provisions of

the Health and Safety Code or any permit, rule, regulation, standard, or requirement issued or adopted pursuant thereto.

1.6. Full Settlement. This Order shall constitute full settlement of the violations alleged below. The Parties, and each of them, agree that this Order, and all of the terms contained herein, are fair, reasonable, and in the public interest. By agreeing to this Order, the Department does not waive any right to take other enforcement actions except as specifically provided in this Order.

1.7. Hearing. Respondent waives any and all rights to a hearing in this matter.

1.8. Admissions. Respondent admits the violations as alleged in Section 2 below.

2. VIOLATIONS ALLEGED

2.1. The Department alleges the following violations:

2.1.1. Respondent Broadcasting Services violated California Health and Safety Code, section 25201(a), in that Respondent engaged in onsite storage of hazardous waste for greater than 90 days without a permit or authorization.

2.1.2. Respondent violated Cal. Code Regs, title 22, sections 66265.16 (a - d), in that Respondent failed to provide a complete, written, training plan and that the training plan provided to DTSC did not contain names, job title, and required training for all persons participating in hazardous waste management activities, emergency response, and contingency plan implementation.

Furthermore, the required training described in Respondent's contingency plan was not listed in Respondent's training plan. Additionally, Respondent failed to provide complete employee training records for all employees participating in

hazardous waste management activities, emergency response, or contingency plan implementation.

2.1.3. Respondent violated California Health and Safety Code, division 20, section 25201(a), in that Respondent failed to keep and maintain onsite adequate recycling records to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the requesting agency or official that the requirements of the exemption or exclusion are being met. Therefore, Respondent treated hazardous waste onsite without a permit or grant of authorization from the department to do so.

2.1.4. Respondent violated Cal. Code Regs., title 22, section 66265.174 in that Respondent failed to inspect all containers containing hazardous wastes on a weekly basis.

2.1.5. Respondent violated Cal. Code Regs., title 22, section 66265.195 in that Respondent failed to provide evidence that all hazardous waste tanks and tank systems were inspected adequately on a daily basis, and that the inspections were based on the criteria listed in Cal. Code Regs., title 22, section 66265.195.

2.1.6. Respondent violated Cal. Code Regs., title 22, sections 66264.191(h)(9) and 66265.193(d) in that Respondent's tank certification did not include 1.) Test results in regards to conveyance system leak testing, and 2.) documentation describing an external liner system.

2.1.7 Respondent violated Cal. Code Regs., title 22, section 66265.193(e) in that Respondent's tank assessment was deficient in documenting demonstration of complete secondary containment requirements.

3. SCHEDULE FOR COMPLIANCE

3.1. Respondent shall comply with the following:

3.1.1. Respondent has corrected the violations set forth above.

3.1.2. Respondent shall operate hereafter in a manner that shall prevent recurrences of the violations cited herein.

3.1.3. Respondent shall make all payments at the time(s) and in accord with any other conditions set forth in Section 5 (Penalty) below.

3.2. Notices and Submittals. All submittals from Respondent pursuant to this Order shall be sent to:

3.3. Communications. All approvals and decisions of the Department made regarding such submittals and notifications shall be communicated to Respondent in writing by the appropriate Performance Manager or his/her designee. No informal advice, guidance, suggestions, or comments by the Department shall relieve Respondent of its obligation to obtain any required formal approvals.

3.4. Department Review and Approval. If the Department determines that any report, plan, schedule, or other document submitted for approval pursuant to this Order fails to comply with this Order or fails to protect public health or safety or the environment, the Department may:

a. Modify the document and approve the document as modified; or

b. Return the document to Respondent with recommended changes and a date by which Respondent must submit to the Department a revised document incorporating the recommended changes.

3.5. Compliance with Applicable Laws. Respondent shall carry out this Order in compliance with all local, State, and federal requirements, including but not limited to requirements to obtain permits and to assure worker safety.

3.6. Endangerment During Implementation. (Reserved, not applicable)

3.7. Site Access. Access to the Site shall be provided at all reasonable times to employees, contractors, and consultants of the Department, and any other agency having jurisdiction. The Department and its authorized representatives shall have the authority to enter and move freely about all property at the Site at all reasonable times for purposes including but not limited to: inspecting records, operating logs, and contracts relating to the Site; reviewing the progress of Respondent in carrying out the terms of this Order; and conducting such tests as the Department may deem necessary. Nothing in this Order is intended to limit in any way the right of entry or inspection that any agency may otherwise have by operation of any law.

3.8. Incorporation of Plans and Reports. All plans, schedules, and reports that were submitted by Respondent pursuant to the violations set forth above and/or this schedule for compliance and were approved by the Department are hereby incorporated into this Order.

3.9. Compliance with Waste Discharge Requirements. Respondent shall comply with all applicable waste discharge requirements issued by the State Water Resources Control Board or a California regional water quality control board.

4. OTHER PROVISIONS

4.1. Liability. Nothing in this Order shall constitute or be construed as a satisfaction or release from liability for any conditions or claims arising as a result of past, current, or future operations of Respondent, except as provided in this Order. Notwithstanding compliance with the terms of this Order, Respondent may be required to take such further actions as are necessary to protect public health or welfare or the environment.

4.2. Penalties for Noncompliance. Failure to comply with the terms of this Order may subject Respondent to costs, penalties and/or damages, as provided by Health and Safety Code, section 25188, and other applicable provisions of law.

4.3. Parties Bound. This Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent and its officers, directors, agents, employees, contractors, consultants, receivers, trustees, successors, and assignees, including but not limited to individuals, partners, and subsidiary and parent corporations, and upon the Department and any successor agency that may have responsibility for and jurisdiction over the subject matter of this Order.

4.4. Integration. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and may not be amended, supplemented, or modified, except as provided in this Order.

4.5. Privileges. Nothing in this Order shall be construed to require any party to waive any privilege, including without limitation, attorney-client and attorney work-product. However, the assertion of any privilege shall not relieve any party of its obligations under this Order.

4.6. Time Periods. "Days" for the purpose of this Order means calendar days.

5. PENALTY

5.1. Respondent shall pay the Department the total sum of \$66,000.00.

5.2. Payment of the total sum specified in paragraph 5.1 is due within 30 days from the effective date of this Order.

5.3. Respondent's check(s) shall be made payable to Department of Toxic Substances Control, shall identify the Respondent and Docket Number, as shown in the caption of this case, and shall be delivered to:
