

# Public Notice

## EXIDE TECHNOLOGIES TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION

EPA ID NO. CAD097854541

Exide Technologies (Exide) submitted an application for a Temporary Authorization to the State of California, Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC). Exide is located at 2700 South Indiana Avenue, Vernon, California, 90058 and operates a metal (lead) treatment and storage/recycling facility at the Vernon location for the recovery of lead from automotive batteries and other lead-bearing materials received from off-site sources. The Temporary Authorization allows implementation of the Stormwater Management System Replacement Plan. The facility's existing stormwater management system will be removed and replaced in order to facilitate timely implementation of corrective action activities.

DTSC approved the Temporary Authorization request on August 21, 2013. DTSC's decision to grant the temporary authorization request under this section may be appealed under the permit appeal procedures of California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Section 66271.18(a) which allows any person to petition DTSC to review any condition of a temporary authorization. The 30-day period within which a person may petition DTSC begins with this notice. The petition shall include a statement of the reasons supporting the review, and a showing that the condition in question is based on:

- (1) a finding of fact or conclusion of law which is clearly erroneous, or
- (2) an exercise of discretion or an important policy consideration which the Department should, in its discretion, review.

The 30-day period for requesting a review ends on November 4, 2013. The petition document may be submitted to Appeals Officer at Department of Toxic Substances Control, 8800 Cal Center Drive, Sacramento, California 95826. A copy of the petition document should also be sent to Bill Veile at the same address.
