STAY OF FINAL MODIFIED HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITY PERMIT FOR FILTER RECYCLING SERVICES, INC., 180 MONTE AVENUE, RIALTO, SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, EPA ID. NO. CAD982444481

Dear Mr. Bennett:

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) has received one petition for review (appeal) of the permit modification decision issued by DTSC on April 21, 2014, for the Filter Recycling Services, Inc. Facility. The petition for review, dated May 27, 2014, was filed by Ms. Deborah Perlman, on behalf of Filter Recycling Services, Inc. and Mr. Wade Riddering.

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66271.14 (b)(2), the permit decision is hereby stayed until DTSC's Permit Appeals Officer has completed review of the petition and determined which, if any, of the issues raised in the petition meet the criteria set forth in California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66271.18 for granting a review.

If DTSC determines that one or more issues raised in the appeal meet the procedural and substantive criteria for granting a review, DTSC will issue an order and a public notice establishing a briefing period, during which interested parties may submit written arguments to DTSC on specified appeal comments. In this case, the stay of permit will continue to be in effect until the final decision on the appeal is issued.

By copy of this letter, I am confirming our email dated June 1, 2014, to the Office of Permitting Project Manager, requesting copies of the Administrative Record for the Filter Recycling Services, Inc. final permit modification decision.

As DTSC's Permit Appeals Officer, I must remain neutral in the process. Therefore, I must refrain from discussing the substance of the permit decision and the appeal with

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all parties or their representatives. You may, however, continue to communicate with staff in the Office of Permitting who issued the permit.
