CONSENT ORDER

Health and Safety Code
Section 25187

Respondent.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Parties. The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (Department) and Huddleston Crane Service, Inc. (Respondent) enter into this Consent Order (Order) and agree as follows:

1.2. Site. Respondent operates as a remediation abatement company transporting asbestos waste (hazardous waste) at the following site: 27545 Maple Street, Taft, CA 93268.

1.3. Inspection. The Department reviewed transporter hazardous waste records as well as manifests for the site on October 20, 2015.

1.4. Authorization Status. Registered transporter with the Department of Toxic Substances Control.

1.5. Jurisdiction. Health and Safety Code, section 25187, authorizes the Department to order action necessary to correct violations and to assess a penalty when the Department determines that any person has violated specified provisions of the Health and Safety Code or any permit, rule, regulation, standard, or requirement issued or adopted pursuant thereto.

1.6. Full Settlement. This Order shall constitute full settlement of the violations alleged below. The Parties, and each of them, agree that this Order, and all of the terms contained herein, are fair, reasonable, and in the public interest. By agreeing to this Order, the Department does not waive any right to take other enforcement actions except as specifically provided in this Order.

1.7. Hearing. Respondent waives any and all rights to a hearing in this matter.

1.8. Admissions. Respondent admits the violations as alleged in Section 2 below.

2. VIOLATIONS ALLEGED

2.1. The Department alleges the following violations:

A. Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 25163 in that Huddleston Crane Service transported hazardous waste without a valid registration by the Department. The violations occurred August 8, 2011, August 29, 2011, September 6, 2011, October 8, 2012 and October 9, 2012.

3. SCHEDULE FOR COMPLIANCE

3.1. Respondent has corrected the violations set forth above.

3.2. Respondent shall make all payments at the time(s) and in accord with any other conditions set forth in Section 5 (Penalty) below.

4. OTHER PROVISIONS

4.1. Liability. Nothing in this Order shall constitute or be construed as a satisfaction or release from liability for any conditions or claims arising as a result of past, current, or future operations of Respondent, except as provided in this Order.

Notwithstanding compliance with the terms of this Order, Respondent may be required to take such further actions as are necessary to protect public health or welfare or the environment.

4.2. Penalties for Noncompliance. Failure to comply with the terms of this Order may subject Respondent to costs, penalties and/or damages, as provided by Health and Safety Code, section 25188, and other applicable provisions of law.

4.3. Parties Bound. This Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent and its officers, directors, agents, employees, contractors, consultants, receivers, trustees, successors, and assignees, including but not limited to individuals, partners, and subsidiary and parent corporations, and upon the Department and any successor agency that may have responsibility for and jurisdiction over the subject matter of this Order.

4.8. Integration. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and may not be amended, supplemented, or modified, except as provided in this Order.

5. PENALTY

5.1. Respondent shall pay the Department the total sum of \$5,691, of which \$2,500 is a penalty and \$3,191 as reimbursement of the Department's costs incurred in this matter.

5.2. Payment of the total sum specified in paragraph 5.1 is due within 30 days from the effective date of this Order.

5.3. Respondent's check(s) shall be made payable to Department of Toxic

Substances Control, shall identify the Respondent and Docket Number, as shown in the caption of this case, and shall be delivered together with the attached Payment

5.4. If Respondent fails to make payment as provided above, Respondent agrees to pay interest at the rate established pursuant to Health and Safety Code, section 25360.1, and to pay all costs incurred by the Department in pursuing collection including attorney's fees.
