Pursuant to section 66270.72, title 22, division 4.5, California Code of Regulations, the Hazardous Waste Interim Status Document issued to Industrial Service Oil Company, Inc. (ISOCI), effective May 23, 1986, is hereby modified to: Expand Hazardous Waste Storage Capacity. In order to expand its storage capacity so that the facility may store used oil after treatment, ISOCI has converted its seven recycled oil product tanks (Tanks 100 - 700) as additional hazardous waste storage. Each of the seven product tanks has an operating capacity of 67,641 gallons. The new hazardous waste storage capacity of the facility will become 823,487 gallons. This additional capacity is for storage after the contents have been treated and are awaiting laboratory analysis and certification as used oil product. No treatment or other processing activities shall take place after the used oil is placed in Tanks 100-700. Used oil regulations (Health & Safety Code § 25250) state that used oil be classified as hazardous waste until it is treated, laboratory analyzed, and certified as "recycled oil."

APPROVAL OF CLASS 2 MODIFICATION TO INTERIM STATUS DOCUMENT, MODIFICATION NUMBER MOD SC3-081105-A, INDUSTRIAL SERVICE OIL COMPANY, INC., 1700 SOUTH SOTO STREET, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA 90023, EPA ID NUMBER CAD 099452708

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) has reviewed and approved the following Class 2 Interim Status Document (ISD) modification to the May 23, 1986 Hazardous Waste ISD for Industrial Service Oil Company, Inc. (ISOCI): Expansion of Hazardous Waste Storage Capacity. In order to expand its storage capacity so that the facility may store used oil after treatment, ISOCI has converted its seven recycled oil product tanks (Tanks 100 - 700) as additional hazardous waste storage. Each of the seven product tanks has an operating capacity of 67,641 gallons. The new hazardous waste storage capacity of the facility will become 823,487 gallons. This additional capacity is for storage after the contents have been treated and are awaiting laboratory analysis and certification as used oil product. No treatment or other processing activities shall take place after the used oil is placed in Tanks 100-700. Used oil regulations (Health & Safety Code § 25250) state that used oil be classified as hazardous waste until it is treated, laboratory analyzed, and certified as "recycled oil."

ISOCI's letter, dated February 3, 2005 to the DTSC served as notification of ISOCI's request to modify the ISD. DTSC concurs that these updates and changes qualify as a Class 2 ISD modification.

In accordance with the California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66270.72, ISOCI sent a public notice of the proposed modification to all persons on the facility's mailing list and the relevant appropriate entities of state and local government on February 12, 2005. The notification was also published in the Los Angeles Times newspaper on February 13, 2005 and in the La Opinion newspaper on February 15, 2005.

In accordance with the California Code of Regulations, title 22 section 66270.42(b)(5), the public was provided with a 60-day period to comment on the modification request.

In accordance with the California Code of Regulations, title 22 section 66270.42(b)(4), a public meeting was held to allow the public to comment on the modification request. The meeting was held at the Robert Louis Stevenson Branch Library in Los Angeles on March 19, 2005. No member of the public attended this meeting.

DTSC received a set of four comments during the public comment period. DTSC responded to each of the comments in a Response to Comments Document. There is no change made to the proposed ISD modification as a result of the public comments received.

The modification decision may be appealed in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 66271.18(a), which provides that any person may petition the Department for review of any permit conditions that have been changed due to this ISD modification. In addition, any person who filed comments, or participated in the public hearing, on an ISD modification decision (during the comment period for the ISD modification decision) may petition the Department to review any condition of the permit modification, decision to the extent that the issues raised in the petition for review were either: (i) also raised during the public comment period for the ISD modification decision, including the public hearing, or (ii) were not reasonably ascertainable at the time of the public comment period.

The petition shall include a statement of the reasons supporting that review, including a demonstration that any issues raised were raised during the public comment period (including any public hearing) to the extent required by these regulations and when appropriate, a showing that the condition in question is based on:

- (1) a finding of fact or conclusion of law which is clearly erroneous, or
- (2) an exercise of discretion or an important policy consideration which the Department should, in its discretion, review.

The thirty day period within which a person may request a review begins on August 16, 2005, and ends on September 14, 2005. The petition must be sent to:
