**Draft Expansion of Interim Measures Work Plan
For Triumph Processing – Embee Division, Inc.
Public Comment Period: March 13 – April 13, 2015**

WHAT IS BEING PROPOSED: The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) invites your comments on the draft Expansion of Interim Measures Work Plan (EIMWP) for Triumph Processing – Embee Division, Inc., located at 2136 South Hathaway, Santa Ana, California (Site). The purpose of the EIMWP is to reduce concentrations of onsite chemicals in soil and groundwater, and further reduce the potential for offsite migration of chemicals in groundwater.

Based on the current information, the chemicals in the soil and groundwater do not pose immediate health concern and local drinking water meets all applicable State and Federal standards. However, since the contamination is present in groundwater at concentrations above regulatory levels, DTSC determined that the interim measures were necessary to protect our environment. In 2009, DTSC reviewed and approved Interim Measures that reduce chemicals at the Site. The expansion of interim measures is intended to further reduce chemicals, mainly volatile organic compounds, in areas that are not currently being remediated under the existing Interim Measures.

The EIMWP proposes biodegrading the contaminants and requires additional installation of over 30 injection wells in new locations on the Site. Emulsified vegetable oil (EVO) will be injected in the new wells to initiate biodegradation. The EVO is a mixture of vegetable oil, environmentally safe detergent (e.g., similar to household dish soap) and water. The EVO poses no risk to public health, safety or the environment.

CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA): In compliance with CEQA, DTSC has determined that the impact to human health and the environment would be less than significant and a Negative Declaration has been prepared for this project.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: We encourage your participation.
