

Request for a Used Oil Testing and Reporting Agreement with DTSC

California Health and Safety Code Section 25250.29 requires hazardous waste transporters to ensure each load of used oil that is shipped to a transfer facility, recycling facility, or out-of-state facility be tested to meet the following criteria:

- Flashpoint above 100 degrees Fahrenheit
- Polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) concentration of less than 5 ppm
- Total halogen content of 1000 ppm or lower

Out-of-state facilities that choose to provide the service of satisfying California's testing requirements on behalf of the transporter must establish a testing and reporting agreement with the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC). The out-of-state facility must be able to demonstrate how the testing and reporting criteria will be met upon submittal of the request (see Used Oil Testing and Reporting Requirements attachment). The out-of-state facility will be required to enter into a Reimbursement Agreement (RA) with DTSC for costs associated with the testing and reporting agreement.

Out-of-state used oil recycling facilities must complete the following information to begin the review process for a used oil testing and reporting agreement with the DTSC.

3. Reimbursement Agreement Contact Information

California Health and Safety Code 25250.30 requires the out-of-state facility to reimburse DTSC's full reasonable costs associated with the testing and reporting agreement, including any inspections necessary to ensure compliance with the agreement.
