



Manifest Exception Reports

- If a Generator has not received a signed copy of the manifest from the TSDF **after 35 days** from the date the waste was shipped, the Generator is required to contact the Transporter and TSDF to determine the status of the waste shipment.
 - If shipped by water, 60 days triggers search.

Manifest Exception Reports

- If after contacting the TSDF and Transporter, the Generator has not received a signed copy of the manifest, the Generator is required to file an Exception Report with DTSC.
- If the Generator receives a signed copy from the TSDF, then an Exception Report is not necessary.

Manifest Exception Reports

- The Exception Report needs to include the following:
 - a legible copy of the manifest;
 - a cover letter explaining what the Generator has done to locate the hazardous waste and the results of those efforts.

Manifest Exception Reports

- A Generator files an exception report after:
 - 45 days for Generators ≥ 1000 kg/month
 - 60 days for Generators < 1000 kg/month
 - 90 days for Gen. that shipped by water




Other Manifest Reports

- TSDFs:
 - Unmanifested waste report
 - Unresolved significant discrepancies reports

These go to DTSC's Generator Information Services Section

Most Common Manifest Errors

- Incomplete Information
- Inaccurate Information
- Failing to **verify** information on a pre-printed manifest at shipment

Most Common Manifest Errors

- Failing to **delete** pre-printed information for waste not shipped.
- Incorrect or incomplete dates; future or past dates.
- Same transporter company signing more than once.

Manifest Correction Letters

- DTSC may charge \$20 per manifest for corrections.
- Generators are charged the fee.
- DTSC is not charging the fee if the company files correction **before** DTSC sends a correction letter.
- Manifest errors can be expensive (>\$17,000)

Self-Reported Manifest Corrections

- Send DTSC a manifest correction letter to:
Department of Toxic Substances Control
Generator Information Services Section
P. O. Box 806
Sacramento, CA 95812-0806
- A single correction letter may be used to correct multiple manifests.

Self-Reported Manifest Corrections

- Provide the following information:
 - Manifest number;
 - Shipment date;
 - Generator EPA ID number;
 - Manifest Item number;
 - Corrected information;
 - Signature, title, mailing address, and phone number.

Manifest Copy Retention

- Generators, Transporters and TSDFs are required to retain manifest copies for three years.
- The three year period is automatically extended:
 - During an unresolved enforcement action
 - At the request of DTSC/U.S. EPA
