DTSC Recognizes Central Valley Firm For Pollution Prevention

SACRAMENTO – The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) will honor the Valley Chrome Plating and its president Ray Lucas for taking steps to significantly prevent pollution in the Clovis/Fresno area and leading the industry in greening their business. Valley Chrome, which joined DTSC's Metal Finishing Model Shop program in 2008 implemented a "cleaner, greener way" to manufacture truck bumpers and truck accessories. An award ceremony will be held on Thursday Oct 7th 2010, followed by a media tour of the facility.

During the past two years, DTSC experts helped Valley Chrome make its business more environmentally friendly and reduce pollution. The company, a leading manufacturer of truck bumpers and accessories, has now switched chemicals used during its manufacturing process from hexavalent chrome, a carcinogen, to trivalent chrome, which is much less toxic. This means:

- Eliminating about 3,000 pounds per year of potential lead waste that could have ended up in landfills
- Eliminating 6,000 pounds per year of hexavalent chrome waste.
- A safer, less-toxic manufacturing process

By participating in DTSC's Metal Finishing Model Shop program, Valley Chrome has demonstrated its commitment to being "green" while aiming for innovation and industry leadership.
