California Department of Toxic Substances Control to Host Public Workshops on Safer Alternative Regulations and Green Chemistry Wiki

Sacramento, CA - Cal/EPA's Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) will hold a public workshop in Sacramento to solicit input on the development of safer alternative regulations for the state's Green Chemistry programs. In addition, DTSC officials at the workshop will discuss the department's recent launching of an online "wiki" site to assist in garnering comments on building these Green Chemistry regulations. The wiki, found on DTSC's website, allows anyone to access and contribute or modify content.

The DTSC workshops, which are planned throughout California in the next few months, are being held in support of landmark Green Chemistry legislation signed into law last year. On September 29, 2008, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger signed Assembly Bill 1879 (Feuer) and Senate Bill 509 (Simitian), two laws that are part of California's Green Chemistry program. These new laws authorize California state government to develop an alternatives analysis framework to stimulate the rapid acceleration of replacement of harmful chemicals and ingredients with safer alternatives in products sold in the state.
