FIELD WORK BEGINNING ON OR ABOUT JUNE 13, 2016

The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is distributing this notice to inform the community about upcoming Phase I work at 1601 Mariposa Site located at several addresses including 1601 and 1677 Mariposa Street and 485 – 497 Carolina Street in San Francisco, California 94107. Phase I of the Response Plan implementation involves removal of the Underground Storage Tanks and associated contaminated soil. Phase II of the Response Plan will involve placing a cover and Vapor Intrusion Mitigation System that will happen in 2017 – 2019.

The 3.36 acre site is zoned as Urban Mixed Use and is planned for residential and commercial development. Site soil is contaminated with metals (lead, arsenic, and nickel) and total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) (diesel and motor oil). The draft Response Plan is a cleanup plan for the Site and after cleanup will allow for residential use at the site. Work on the site will include excavation and off-site disposal of three underground storage tanks and petroleum contaminated soil.

The cleanup will begin on or about June 13, 2016; taking about a week to complete. Workers will be on the Site **Monday – Friday between 7:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.**

The following work activities will take place:

- Staging of heavy equipment, vehicle parking, and trucks entering and leaving the Site and barricades or fencing will be installed to minimize access;
- Earth moving activities, including soil removal, stockpiling, and fill placement and grading;
- Excavating approximately 730 cubic yards of soil will be directly loaded on to trucks for off-site disposal. If soil must be temporarily stored prior to off-site disposal, soil will be covered with heavy-duty plastic sheeting;
- Water will be sprayed to control dust and haul trucks will be covered with tarps;
- Vehicle speeds on Site will be limited to 15 mph and vehicles will be swept clean prior to leaving the Site;
- Air monitoring will be set up around the perimeter to monitor any dust generated during the soil cleanup and handling activities.
- About 40 trucks will enter and exit on Mariposa Street and follow designated truck routes to and from the site. The truck routes include Carolina Street to 16th Avenue. Trucks will be restricted from Mariposa Street east of the Site.


