## You Can Review and Comment on the draft Cherryland Community Center Cleanup Plan, Hayward

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) invites you to review and comment on the proposed cleanup of the property planned for the Cherryland Community Center. This property is located at 278 Hampton Road and 17482 Boston Road. DTSC and Alameda County found lead and pesticide residues in several small areas there. A plan called the draft Removal Action Workplan (RAW) describes how we will clean up the Site. Please see the map on page two.

### Site History

The former owners used this land for an orchard and other farm businesses. Homes and farm outbuildings have since been demolished.

### Draft Removal Action Workplan (RAW)

The draft RAW describes a few options to clean up the Site. We evaluated capping and limiting Site access. We also looked at removing and transporting the contamination off-site. DTSC recommends removal of the polluted soil and transporting it to the permitted and authorized disposal landfill. We invite you to review and comment on the draft RAW.

### California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

CEQA is a law that makes agencies consider how the cleanup will affect the community. As part of the CEQA requirement, DTSC prepared an Addendum to the already approved 2015 Alameda County Environmental Impact Report. The Addendum states that the proposed cleanup will not have a significant negative impact on human health and the environment.
