The mission of DTSC is to protect California's people and environment from harmful effects of toxic substances by restoring contaminated resources, enforcing hazardous waste laws, reducing hazardous waste generation, and encouraging the manufacture of chemically safer products.

## Removal of Soil at 9901 S. Alameda Street Continues through Spring 2016

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is overseeing the removal of contaminated soil at the vacant lot at 9901 S. Alameda Street. The site has chemicals left over from manufacturing, trucking operations and waste storage. Clean soil is brought in to fill the holes. The Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles (HACLA) is conducting the cleanup.

The removal of the soil takes place between 8:00am and 6:00pm during weekdays. There are a number of safety measures taken to protect workers and the community including:

- Dirt is sprayed with water to keep dust down;
- Piles of dirt are covered with a special soil cement spray to keep dust down;
- Dirt on trucks will be covered and decontaminated before they leave the site;
- Air is tested all day during the removal operation;
- The soil removal will stop if it is windy or chemicals are detected in the air.
