### FIELD WORK SCHEDULED TO BEGIN JANUARY 11, 2016

The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) wants to inform the community that Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) will conduct additional environmental investigation work at Riverside Drive and Elm Street in Napa, California. This work will help prepare a cleanup plan for soil and groundwater impacted by a former manufactured gas plant (MGP) that operated on the property from 1889 to 1924. The samples collected will be analyzed for chemicals associated with the historic-gas making process, including polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) and metals.

**Work Planned:** Work will begin on Monday, January 11 and continue through March 2016. Work will occur between the hours of 7:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday and includes:

- Drilling approximately 35 soil borings (holes) and installing approximately seven groundwater monitoring wells and twelve gas sampling probes using a drill rig or hand auger;
- Collecting samples from soil borings and from new and existing groundwater monitoring wells and soil gas sampling probes;
- Filling in soil borings after sampling; and
- Conducting general cleanup of all work areas.

A majority of the work will take place inside PG&E's fenced property. However, some of the soil borings and groundwater monitoring wells will be installed off-site to the east of Riverside Drive and on neighboring properties to the west. All work will be conducted under a DTSC approved workplan. Work areas will be sectioned off and the work will look like typical surveying and/or construction projects. While a large portion of the work will be conducted using only hand tools, community members may see trucks with mounted drill rigs while crews install some of the deeper borings both on and off-site.

PG&E does not anticipate any significant disruption to the community from the proposed work. It is anticipated that truck traffic will be limited to a few trucks per day. When working in off-site areas, all work will be completed under a City-approved permit that includes a traffic control plan to safely direct traffic and pedestrians around the work area.
