Soil Removal Work Starting June 27

The Northern End of the Railyards
501 Jibboom Street, Sacramento CA 95814

What is the work?

- **Starting June 27**, workers will remove soil contaminated with metals in a 2.5 acre area called the Lagoon Northwest Corner Triangle Area.
- Crews will test the contaminated soil to decide where to send that soil.

When will you see work?

- Work continues through September, 2016;
- Monday – Friday, 7 AM to 7 PM.

How will workers control dust and odors?

- Workers will use water to control both dust and odors.
- If wind is at or above 20 miles an hour, workers will stop all activity.

How much soil will workers remove and where does it go?

- Crews will excavate about 23,000 cubic yards of soil.
- Some soil will stay on Site and be re-used in other locations.
- Workers will ship some soil off-site. Workers will load this soil onto rail cars for transport to licensed landfills.

How will the work impact you?

- During the day, you may hear construction noise.

Who will do the work?

- Contractors for Union Pacific Railroad, under the oversight of DTSC.
