WORK NOTICE
Watson Park Site
San Jose, California
July 2009



Field Work being conducted beginning July 13, 2009

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) and the City of San Jose are distributing this notice to inform the community about upcoming work at Watson Park, located adjacent to the intersection of North 22nd and East Jackson Streets, in San Jose, California (See attached figure).

Workers will be in the area starting on **Monday, July 13 between 8:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M.** This stage of the field work will take about eight (8) to twelve (12) weeks to complete. During this time the park will remain closed to the public and following work activities will be observed:

- Removal of trees and vegetation which will be turned into mulch. The City of San Jose has already started topping off the trees but the trunk and soil removal work will begin during this time.
- Demolition of existing structures. Concrete will be ground up for reuse.
- Earth moving activities, including moving of the stockpile and grading areas.
- Continuous dust monitoring and suppression activities.
- Installing new park structures and parking lots.

This work will be done according to the Remedial Action Plan (RAP), which has been reviewed and approved by DTSC and the City of San Jose Park Master Plan. The RAP and other site related documents are available for your review at the informational repository at:
