## Five Year Review Evaluation of Remedy Effectiveness at Cambridge Estates 8321 King Rd, Loomis, CA 95650

The California Department of Toxic substances Control (DTSC) has conducted and finalized a Five-Year Review to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedy completed in September 2004 at the former Whitebridge Subdivision located at 8231 King Road, Loomis, CA 95650.

Soil contaminated with mainly arsenic and lead was excavated, consolidated, and placed underneath Ashley Road in 2004. A Land Use Covenant was recorded on a portion of Ashley Rd. to limit the land use to a road. An Operation and Maintenance Agreement was entered to maintain the road to prevent exposure. DTSC has concluded that the remedy continues to provide long term protection to public health and the environment.
