## DTSC to start soil cleanup at World Radiator, 8336 Skyway, Paradise

### Introduction

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) will begin cleanup of contaminated soil at the former World Radiator and Air Conditioning site at 8336 Skyway in Paradise starting **April 2, 2007 and ending on or about May 1, 2007**. In September 2005, DTSC approved the Final Removal Action Workplan, which describes the cleanup actions, to remove soil polluted with lead, arsenic and antimony.

The work will include the following activities:

- Demolish the two buildings and pull out the septic system;
- Remove and dispose of all building debris, the septic system, the concrete slab and walkway (around the two buildings);
- Remove contaminated soil;
- Backfill all dug out areas with clean, imported soil.

### Description of Work

DTSC's contractor will dig up and remove about 400 cubic yards of soil. They will use backhoes and loaders to place the soil into dump trucks and remove it to an authorized landfill for disposal. Excavations will be up to 10 feet in depth. Soil along the fence line of the bordering property to the north will be removed up to two feet below ground surface. We will test the bottom of each dug out area to see if we have removed the contamination and then we will backfill dug out areas with clean soil. The nearest residences are about 100 feet to the north and about 100 feet to the east of the site.

Workers will **begin at 7 a.m. and end at 5 p.m. each weekday**. They will do the digging as required by the site health and safety plan. Workers will spray water onto the soil to keep dust down. Air monitors will measure dust. Workers will check the monitors regularly to see that they have safe air levels. If high winds come up, workers will stop all soil moving or demolition activities immediately. At a maximum, contractors will have 15 trucks coming and going from the site per day.
