WORK NOTICE for the **Zeneca Site, Richmond** (aka: Campus Bay or Former Stauffer Chemical)

Beginning today, August 8 and continuing through Wednesday, August 10, contractors will be collecting and analyzing soil gas samples on the Zeneca Site.

The contractors will be collecting soil gas samples surrounding the existing building where the Making Waves afternoon school program will be held this upcoming school area and along the eastern portion of the Zeneca complex. Samples will be tested in a mobile laboratory that will be brought on site. Half of the samples will also be collected and sent to an off-site laboratory for verification.

The purpose of this soil gas sampling is two-fold. The first objective is to evaluate soil gas levels near the building where the school children will be attending classes. Levels will be compared to the recently issued California Human Health Screening Levels (CHHSLs). If levels exceeding these screening levels are detected, then indoor air sampling will be conducted in the building. The second objective is to assist in determining where future soil and groundwater sampling will take place. The sampling results should be available in 2-3 weeks.
